WELCOME FROM THE HEADTEACHER



Dear Parents / Carers, Staff and Trustees,

I would like to offer a sincere thank you to everyone in the Hailey Hall community for your support over this autumn term. Despite the challenges posed by Covid-19, I am very proud of all of us in how we have responded and coped in the most challenging of times. We have all been fantastic in adapting to some significant changes in how we function as a school. These include changes to the timings of the school day, pupils working bubbles, everyone wearing face coverings, virtual parent evenings and most impressively, adapting to 2 weeks of remote learning. The effort by the staff to adapt quickly to teaching online and parents' support in helping their child engage with this new way of learning was fantastic. I am extremely happy with the level of engagement shown by the pupils over this period and the excellent feedback from parents and pupils.

Despite the challenges, we have still ensured an excellent quality of education for our pupils. Our Recovery Curriculum is in place to minimise the impact of lost learning over the spring and summer term period of the last academic year. We have still managed to ensure excellent attendance and the behaviour from the pupils has been very good.

In order to aid our efforts from January, the Department for Education have very recently announced that teachers and pupils will have access to rapid testing to

help keep schools and colleges open throughout the spring term.

From January, starting with secondary schools and including all special schools, the education workforce will be eligible for weekly on the spot tests. This will help identify asymptomatic cases – which make up a third of all cases – limiting the spread of the virus. This will be backed up by daily testing for staff who have been in close contact with a positive case, therefore eliminating the need for self-isolation and allowing them to continue to come into school or college. Pupils will be eligible for daily testing if they have been in close contact with a positive case.

This is still very recent news and while I am excited and encouraged by this, I do have questions regarding how this will work in our school. When I have clarity on this situation, I will naturally communicate this with you.

Thank you all once again for your ongoing support and I wish you all, a very merry Christmas and a happy New Year!

I look forward to seeing you back in the New Year on Monday 4th January 2021.


