On a Cold and bright February morning, our Yr. 11 pupils were taken by school minibus to Hertfordshire University, De Havilland campus in Hatfield.



This visit is part of our ongoing support for our Yr. 11 's regarding their Post 16 options and future education pathways in accordance with:

Gatsby Benchmark 7, (Encounters with further and higher education)



On arrival to the campus, we were met by Emma from the University who had organised the visit and itinerary for the day, and her colleagues, John and Andrew. We were taken through the college and went to a classroom where the pupils were introduced to a Q&A session on University life, routes

from school to University, how many different universities around, the country, etc., and with the use of individual laptops, our pupils engaged in a fun quiz on what they knew about University and University life.

We then split into 2 groups and went on a tour of the campus seeing various amenities such as the Sports Hall. Lecture theatres, social areas, accommodation, Library, Learning, and studying zones. The Campus was very busy with students moving around the campus and our pupils dealt very well with all the hustle and bustle they encountered.



After lunch, we worked together in 2 teams in friendly competition with a Fun quiz with discussions on budgeting, etc. Our pupils engaged well and they all were given a bag containing literature/pens/Diary/usb stick to take away as a memory of their visit to the university.

As part of Hailey Hall's continuing support for our pupils regarding education and career pathways, (Gatsby Benchmark 5-Encounters with Employers and employees) I arranged a visit on 14th March for our Year,10 pupils. We went in school transport to the Spotlight Theatre in Hoddesdon to visit a Careers Fair. This event was organised in conjunction with the Careers and Enterprise Company (CEC) and Hertfordshire opportunities Portal (HOP).

The event was opened by the Mayor of Broxbourne Mr Paul Seeby. We were given the first time slot at 10.15am – 11.00am, as consideration was given to pupils with SEND and so the event was a lot quieter and there were fewer people in the venue and our pupils would not feel any unnecessary pressure with any sensory issues.

Many careers industries were represented from Hospitality, Uniform services, Banking, Colleges, Construction, and Media to name a few. The boys were encouraged to have a look around all the stalls and ask questions about the various careers. The boys engaged with this, with support from Hailey Hall staff.

The boys will be engaged with Work Experience week later in June 2023 so it was good for them to see the opportunities that are available. I was also able to make good contacts for future Work experience placements

The boys and staff enjoyed using the trampolines and then had a much-needed trip to MacDonald's afterwards.


During the trip boys from different year groups interacted socially with each other and whilst trampolining some of them had a game of tag ball with staff.
