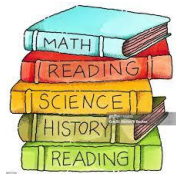

## Year 11 Mock Interview Training with "Job Centre Plus" (Gov Uk, Works and Pensions) 12<sup>TH</sup> Nov 2025

In line with Hailey Hall's ongoing commitment to supporting our pupils with their education and future career pathways, the following activity was organised in accordance with:

- Gatsby Benchmark 2: Learning from Career and Labour Market Information
- Gatsby Benchmark 3: Supporting the Needs of Each Pupil
- Gatsby Benchmark 5: Encounters with Employers and Employees
- Gatsby Benchmark 8: Personal Guidance

On Wednesday 12th November 2025, Hailey Hall welcomed a valued friend of the school, Elizabeth Parry from Jobcentre Plus (Department for Work and Pensions).

Elizabeth attended to support our current Year 11 pupils, who will soon be applying for their preferred college courses. As part of preparing them for the interview process, each student participated in a 20-minute one-to-one mock interview with Elizabeth. During these sessions, she discussed key aspects of successful interview practice, including:

- The importance of punctuality and presentation
- Being prepared to ask relevant questions about the course
- Answering questions honestly, clearly, and confidently
- Staying focused on the subject and course applied for

- Understanding course content and opportunities for taster days

All pupils conducted themselves maturely and respectfully throughout the process. Elizabeth provided individual feedback to support each student's development and confidence going forward.

We are pleased to say that Elizabeth will continue to work with Hailey Hall, returning in the coming months to speak with pupils across all year groups on a range of careers-related topics.

### Year 10 Visit to Herts Regional College (HRC) Turnford - 19<sup>TH</sup> Nov 2025



On Wednesday, 19th November 2025, Year 10 pupils from Hailey Hall School were taken by school transport to visit **Herts Regional College (HRC)** in Turnford. This visit was organised in accordance with **Gatsby Benchmark 7 – Encounters with Further and Higher Education**, reflecting Hailey Hall's ongoing commitment to supporting pupils with their post-16 education and career pathways.

Upon arrival, pupils were welcomed by Katrina, the College's Community and Schools Liaison Marketing Officer.

The visit began with a presentation outlining the wide range of courses available at HRC, including **Level 1 qualifications, T-Levels, Apprenticeships, and Higher Education options.**

Speakers also discussed the **support available to pupils** and the variety of **clubs and enrichment activities** offered at the college.

Katrina had arranged an engaging and informative morning, during which pupils toured a range of departments including **Sports, ICT, Creative Media, Engineering, Performing Arts, Catering, Motor Mechanics, Cabin crew and Construction.** In each area, a guest speaker provided valuable insights into the courses, facilities, and possible career pathways related to their subjects.

Staff explained that while HRC Turnford may not be every student's preferred post-16 destination, the purpose of the visit was to allow them to experience a different learning environment and to understand how college life differs from school. When pupils begin their post-16 applications in Year 11, **bespoke visits** will be arranged to their individual college preferences if required.

All pupils represented Hailey Hall School exceptionally well, behaving responsibly and showing genuine interest throughout the visit. They asked thoughtful and appropriate questions about college life and the courses available.

The visit concluded late morning, with pupils returning to school to continue their normal timetable and enjoy a well-deserved lunch.

### YEAR 11 Visit to John Warner School, Hoddesdon Sixth Form - 9<sup>th</sup> Dec 2025

#### Gatsby Benchmark 7 "Encounters with Higher and Further Education"



On arrival at the school, we were met by Miss Hayley Wood-Thompson, Director of Sixth Form at John Warner School. Following initial introductions, she provided a guided tour of the school, highlighting the different areas and pathways available to pupils depending on their subject choices.

John Warner School offers modern, up-to-date facilities, and our pupils were impressed by the calm atmosphere throughout the school. They observed pupils fully engaged in their lessons within their subject areas. During the visit, our pupils were informed about the key differences between college and sixth form education, including that college often focuses on a single subject, whereas sixth form typically involves studying three subjects. This comparison prompted noticeable interest and discussion among the pupils.

At the end of the tour, we met with current sixth form pupils at various stages of their education, who provided valuable insight into what it is like to attend sixth form, the advantages it offers, and their future career intentions, ranging from

joining the Army, Politics, Dentistry to name just a few varied careers after completing their studies at John Warner School. Hailey Hall pupils asked relevant and appropriate questions and gained valuable information to support them in making informed post-16 pathway decisions.

At the conclusion of the visit, Hailey Hall pupils expressed their thanks to the staff for the tour, after which we returned to Hailey Hall School to continue with the normal timetable.

In the coming weeks, pupils will be supported with discussions and guidance regarding their post-16 applications. As a result of this visit, they now have a clearer understanding of the differences between college and sixth form pathways and are better equipped to make informed decisions about their preferred route. Pupils will continue to receive support throughout this process until they leave Hailey Hall School and transition to their next destination in September.

Pupils were extremely well behaved throughout the visit and were a credit to Hailey Hall School. Thank you to staff member Jack O'Sullivan for his support during the visit.

### FESTIVE TREATS TO TRY!

#### Crispy chocolate Christmas Puds



#### Ingredients (for 25-30 Xmas puds)

- 70g butter
- 100g milk chocolate
- 200g marshmallows
- 180g coco pops

#### To decorate

- 150g white chocolate
- Sprinkles
- Icing sugar to dust

#### Method

- Melt butter, milk chocolate and marshmallows in a pan.
- Add coco pops, allow to cool.
- Roll into small truffle size balls.
- Melt white chocolate and spoon on top of each ball letting it drizzle down the sides.
- Top with sprinkles, dust with icing sugar leave in the fridge to set briefly.
